Explaining our Roles

Doctors

Dr Pearce

Dr Pearce is in surgery 4 days a week on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Like all our doctors he has some pre-bookable appointments available in advance. The remaining appointments are kept back to be used for emergency on the day appointments.

As well as his normal surgery, Dr Pearce also does Minor Surgery on things such as verrucas, moles etc. In the first instance please book a routine appointment with one of the doctors.

Dr Newey

Dr Newey is in surgery four days a week on: Mondays, Tuesdays & Wednesdays (morning only); and Fridays. Dr Newey specialises in Respiratory, Asthma and Care of the Elderly.

Dr Brennan

Dr Brennan is in surgery on Tuesdays. Dr Brennan specialises in: family planning and is able to fit or remove implants & coils. Please book a routine appointment in advance if you would like to discuss family planning with her. Dr Brennan also does Minor Surgery.

Practice Nurses

Lesley Barratt - specialises in diabetes

Heather Johnson - specialises in: asthma and COPD; leg ulcers

As well as routine appointments for dressings, ear syringes, travel vaccinations,

Health Care Assistant

Lisa Preece is our Health Care Assistant who specialises in phlebotomy; ECG's; Health Checks; Blood Pressures; and New Patient Health Checks.

Receptionists / Secretaries

We are a small surgery and our Receptionists / Secretaries are able to do a variety of tasks, besides booking appointments and answering telephone queries. On a daily basis our Administration team will be issuing prescriptions, sorting and scanning post into patient records, registering new patients, sorting new patients notes, making up appointments on screen, booking locum doctors, invoicing, obtaining results from the hospitals and typing letters. They do a very varied role and our administration staff have limited time available to them,. This is why they often do not have the time available to contact hospitals to chase for appointments and we will ask patients to do this directly.

Flu Clinic Saturday 6th October 2012

Our annual flu clinic will be on Saturday the 8th October 2011 at the Colwall Park Hotel from 10am until 12.30pm. As usual we are not making appointments, but would ask where your surname corresponds with the times given below that you attend at that time. Adhering to these times ensures a swift service and helps to prevent patients having to wait a long time for their flu jab. Please do not telephone the surgery to make your appointment.

A—F 10.00—10.30

G—M 10.30—11.00

N—S 11.00—11.30

T—Z 11.30—12.00

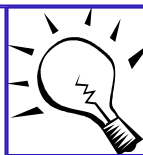
We strongly recommend that you have a seasonal flu vaccination if you are:

- over 65 years of age;
- under 65 years of age and considered to be 'at risk'
e.g. diabetes; asthma; chronic pulmonary Disease; a neurological disease; or are immuno-suppressed.
- Or a registered carer looking after someone else.
- Pregnant

If you are unsure, please seek advice from the Surgery or pick up one of the advice leaflets.

Wasted Appointments for the Doctors and Nurses

Throughout December, January, February and March, despite having booked them, there were **260** appointments not used by patients. This figure amounts to over **43 hours** of clinical time wasted. If you are unable to attend an appointment you have booked with either the Doctor or a Nurse please telephone the surgery to cancel it as we are often able to fill these appointments at very short notice.



Did You Know.....

- It is important to update your details with the surgery if you change your: address; telephone number; mobile phone number name; or email address. Keeping your details up to date helps us be able to contact you if we need to.
- You can order repeat prescriptions by email. Just ask for a form at Reception

Ordering a Repeat Prescription

There are several ways you can order a repeat prescription from the Surgery:

1. Complete the repeat prescription slip that lists your medication (given to you when you collect your medication) & either leave it at the Surgery in the box supplied or give it to Colwall Pharmacy who will deliver it to us.
2. Complete one of our Repeat Medication Request Forms held at the Surgery.
3. Email your request using our online service, please ask at Reception for a Form.
4. Post the repeat slip to us with a stamped addressed envelope & we can return it to you by post.

5. Fax your request to us on 01684 540805

We cannot take requests over the phone in case there are any mistakes made.

Please always indicate where you would like the prescription to go or if it should be held at the Surgery. Failure to do this means that we keep the prescription here for safe keeping and this may cause you an inconvenience. We do try our best to accommodate your requests wherever possible, but sometimes, it is not always possible. Please allow 48 hours for any prescription to be ready.

Please ask one of the Receptionists which Pharmacies collect prescriptions from us or if you have any other queries.

Accident & Emergency (A&E)

The primary function of any A&E is to save lives, whether it be from a serious injury or a life threatening disease. Our A&E departments are very busy, and we can help reduce this by only going to A&E when it is absolutely necessary.

You should call 999 if you, or somebody, else needs emergency care fast such as:

- Loss of consciousness
- Acute confused state
- Fits that are not stopping
- Persistent, severe chest pain
- Breathing difficulties
- Severe bleeding that cannot be stopped

When is it appropriate to use A&E?

- You have chest pain
- You suspect you have a broken bone
- You need treatment for something that is not life threatening which can't be dealt with elsewhere.

When is it NOT appropriate to use A&E?

- When you can't get an appointment with your GP
- When you think you might need antibiotics or other forms of medication that you use regularly.

Where else can access Medical Care that is not life threatening?

- NHS Direct (available 24 hours a day) can give health information & advice. Telephone Number 08 45 46 47

- Walk-in-Centres are available to offer a range of treatments every day including the weekends & outside of normal office hours. They can: give health advice; emergency contraception; treatment for minor ailments & infections.
- Minor Injury Units (available 24 hours a day) can give urgent care for things such as: cuts; sprains; minor burns.
- Pharmacies can offer advice for: Minor Ailments; Medicinal advice; Allergies; Bites & Stings; Coughs & Colds; and much more.
